GALENIA HOSPITAL FIRST IN MEXICO TO DECIDE FOR SCC'S TURNKEY CONCEPT

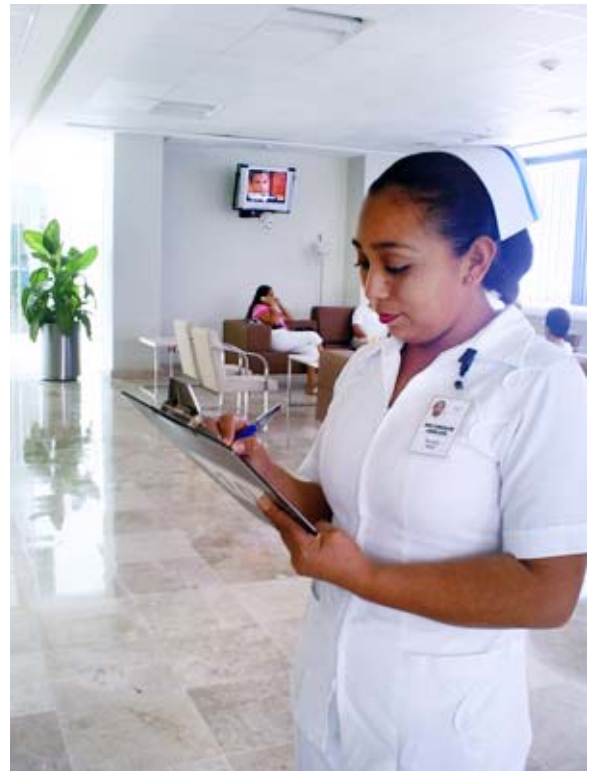
Amazonia S.A. DeVC, owners of Galenia Hospital in Cancun Mexico, decided in a board meeting on December 14th to incorporate, in partnership with SCC, the Special Purpose Company *Cancun Oncology Center S.A.* This means that SCC was selected as the preferred supplier and partner and that SCC's turnkey concept will be implemented in a new wing of the hospital.

The oncology clinic will initially provide Radiotherapy and Brachy Therapy.

The construction work is scheduled to start in February 2010 and the clinical operation in August 2010.

The *Cancun Oncology Center* has already attracted investors and loan providers that will cover the financial needs.

The Galenia Hospital is a multi-specialty hospital located in Cancun, Mexico. Founded in 2006, the hospital today offers World-Class healthcare primarily to patients within the Yucatán region but also to international patients.
